## A Reverse Advent Calendar for St Wilfrid's 2024

Give rather than receive each day in Advent. All you need to do is: 1. Get a bag 2. Add an item into the bag from the list below each day 3. Deliver the bag to St Wilfrid's - after 2 January - or leave them at the back of the church (Any volunteers please to help deliver them?). Items are used throughout the year. You can drop off items at the Centre, (Mon-Fri 9am – 5pm) and you can telephone 255 5720 for more information. The centre has a 7 to 3 ratio of male to female clients, and the items that are needed include: Toiletries: soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, deodorant, incl. toothbrushes, combs, hairbrushes, Clothing, incl. men's underwear (boxer shorts M/L/XL), women's pants - all sizes, hats, gloves, scarves, Food: boxes/tins of individually wrapped chocolates. Other items useful throughout the year include: tinned meat & fish: tuna, casserole, stewing steak, tinned vegetables: potatoes, peas & carrots, tomatoes, tinned rice pudding & custard, jars of pickles, Drinks: cordials, hot chocolate, Store cupboard items: brown sauce, salad cream (not glass), pot noodles & cupa-soups.

Alternatively, people might like to donate locally to the Handsworth Food Bank. Parcels can be brought to church each week and the UCM will deliver to the Food Bank or you can use the collection points in the local supermarkets.

### The Advent Wreath

- The first candle (purple) symbolises hope and it is called the "'Prophets' Candle.' The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.
- The second candle (purple) represents faith and it is called the 'Bethlehem Candle.' Micah had foretold that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem which was also the birthplace of King David.
- The third candle (rose) symbolises joy and it is called the Shepherds' Candle.' To the shepherds' great joy, the angels announced that Christ came for humble, unimportant people like them, too. In the liturgy the colour rose signifies joy and so this candle represents rejoicing.
- The fourth candle (purple) represents peace and it is called the 'Angels' Candle.' The angels announced that the Messiah came to bring peace. He came to reconcile people with God and to bring us closer to each other.
- The fifth candle (white) represents light and purity and it is called 'Christ's Candle.' It is placed in the middle of the wreath and it is lit on Christmas Day. This candle is white to represent the Lord's pure light and victory.
